2013 was a very important year for Changing Children's Worlds Foundation. The second official year of operations, it was key to gauge the potential success of our organization and programs going forward.

Our belief that there is a strong and GROWING need for our International Child/Parent Development Program (ICDP), as well as Integrative Youth Development within every community has been confirmed. The evidence for this includes:

- The Prtizker Early Education Foundation Grant - to implement the ICD throughout Chicago-area, including Carpentersville, Cicero, Englewood, Schaumburg and Howard Area/Rogers Park (a \$35,000 investment x 2 years: November 2013–October 2015), more on that separately;
- Identified Needs for ICDP Program for:
 - Families in Communities with high levels of Violence, in a violence-filled Society;
 - Parents of Children with Developmental Delays / Special Needs / Serious Illness;
 - Military-connected Parents (of Families with Veterans re-integrating with families; of Deployed Service Men & Women; of National Guard and Reserves);
 - Teen Parents and their Children (extending to the Grandparents who play key roles as Caregivers);
 - All Families - Universal support for families, providing empathy-based community for all to weather the challenges of parenting and life.
 - An expanding network of partners is supporting ICDP in collaboration with their child protection/ family intervention services.
 - An increased number of parents and children thriving in positive development and relationships, kinder families and communities.

It was also a very challenging year, as CCWF worked to fine-tune its program resource materials: curriculum; Children's Booklets; Parent/Caregiver Handbooks; Facilitator Manuals/Lesson Plans; Educational Resources; Training Materials. This was done through contract staff and volunteers contributing their talents and skills in early childhood development, education, social work and mental health services to ensure high quality resources, adapted for ICDP-USA, in 2014.

Your support has been key to allowing Changing Children's Worlds Foundation to explore how we might work within communities to change social norms - by encouraging parents/caregivers to seek out and welcome supportive community environments, and strengthening their empathy-based parenting, which ensures that their children will be stronger, healthier, empathetic and caring, and safer.

We thank you for your generous support to-date, and encourage you to continue your important support as we advance our work in 2014!

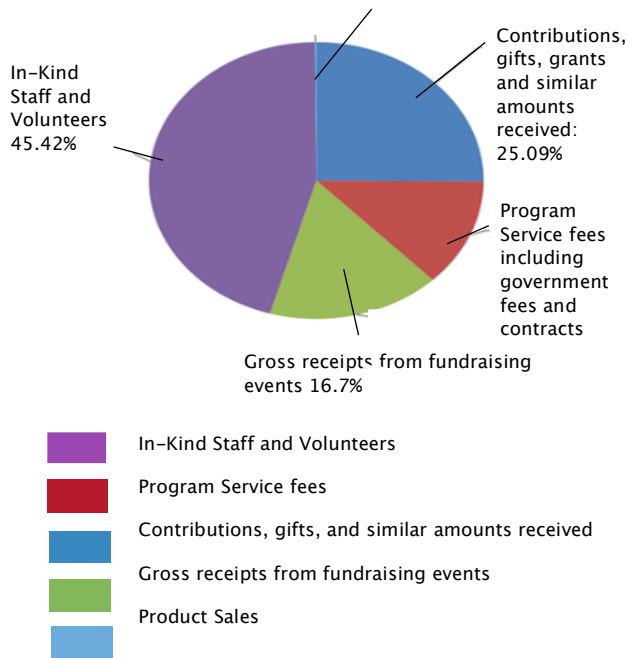

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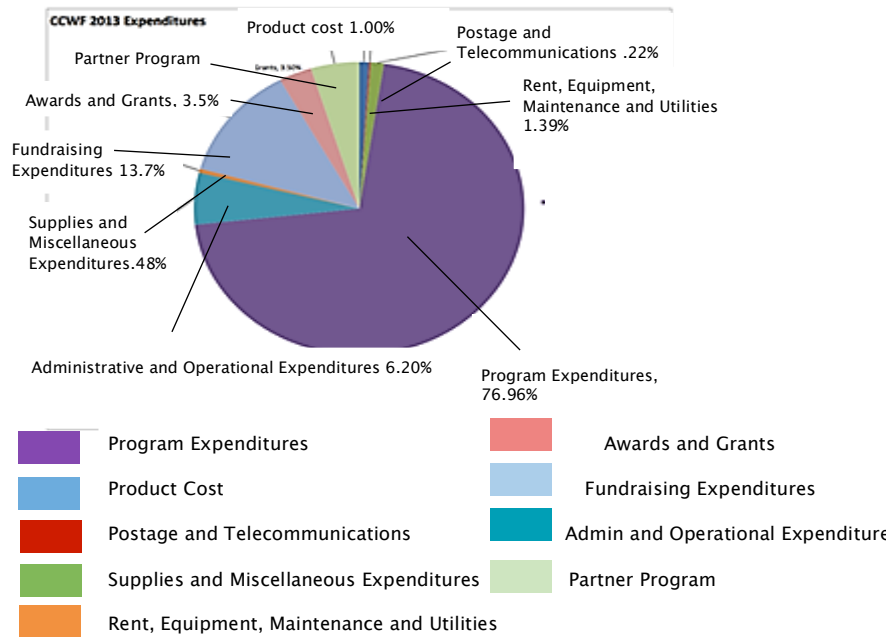
